GENERAL GUIDELINES

Please place all materials in your provided cart for proper and efficient pickup. Ensure all carts are facing the curb as indicated by the arrows on the cart lid. Trash will not be picked up if the cart provided by Northville Township is not curbside on the proper day of service. Please fill your provided cart before setting anything outside of it. If there are excess materials, they must be placed in metal or plastic cans or plastic bags. Do not exceed 35 gallons and 50 pounds. If a worker cannot lift a bag or can, it will be left at the curb. If you regularly generate excess trash that will not fit in your cart, please contact the Northville Township Department of Public Services at (248) 348-5820 to receive an additional cart, free of charge. Cardboard boxes and paper bags cannot be used as trash containers. Improper put-outs will be tagged. A return trip will not be made for confirmed late put-outs.

TIME OF SET OUT

Place rubbish, recyclables and compost at the curb before 7 a.m. on the day of pickup or after 6 p.m the night before.

PLACEMENT

All materials must be placed at the curb or roadside and must not interfere with mail delivery. **Place trash on one side of your driveway and recyclables and compostables on the other.** Be sure the arrows on the lid of the carts are facing the roadway. If there is a ditch in front of your property, place rubbish on the roadside of the ditch. After collection, remove receptacles within 12 hours.

HOLIDAYS

Rubbish collection is not scheduled on:


- New Year's Day
- Thanksgiving
- Labor Day
- Independence Day
- Memorial Day
- Christmas

If your collection day falls on or after these holidays, your pickup will be delayed by one day. If a holiday falls on a weekend, there will be NO delay in the pickup schedule.

HEAVY SNOW

Trucks will be sent out on schedule except in extreme conditions. Place rubbish on TOP of snow. Carts and excess material must be accessible from the road. If trash is frozen to the ground the crew cannot take it. Some services may be temporarily suspended due to weather/road conditions.

ACCEPTED REFUSE

Appliances/Furniture

Refrigerators, washers, dryers, dishwashers, couches, chairs, mattresses, box springs, televisions, lamps, tables, etc. must be set out at the curb with your trash. If bad weather threatens, cover upholstery with plastic to keep it dry and light. DO NOT pack appliances in cardboard boxes. Northville Township ordinance requires refrigerator and freezer doors to be removed before they are set out on the curb. Please ensure all refrigerated units have Freon recaptured by a certified technician before placing curbside for pickup. Refer to the 'Odds and Ends' section of this document for a list of some certified technicians. They will charge you for this service.

Carpeting

Carpeting will be picked up at the curb ONLY if it is rolled up and tied with duct tape or heavy twine. The tied rolls must be no wider than three feet and must not weigh more than 50 pounds per roll. Pieces of carpeting that are too wide and/or not tied will not be picked up. Soft padding and small pieces may be neatly tied or bagged. When bad weather threatens, place pad or carpeting in plastic and tie with kite string to keep large pieces dry and light.

Christmas Trees

Christmas trees will be picked up at the curb for three weeks following Christmas Day. Trees taller than 6 feet should be cut in half before being left outside for pickup.

NOT ACCEPTED

Construction Materials

The following materials will not be picked up: Sand, bricks, concrete blocks, stones, gravel, concrete, cement, lumber, drywall, roofing materials, windows, glass doors, paneling, countertops, flooring, paint, furnaces, and garage doors.

Auto and Outdoor Materials

Other items not accepted include: car parts, tires, railroad ties, sod, dirt of any kind, tree stumps, tree trunks, lawn mowers, pool heaters, metal sheds, swing sets, picnic tables, and large outside items

Dangerous Chemicals/Materials

Do not place any containers with motor oil, liquid paint, poisonous or caustic chemicals, gas tanks, propane tanks, medical waste, needles, asbestos, or ammunition inside a plastic bag or hide them in a receptacle. These may explode upon compaction or cause injuries.

Latex paint can be disposed of on trash collection day with some preparation. First remove the lid, add some clean kitty litter, and stir with a paint stick. After a few days, it will harden. Then, put the cans into your trash cart. Be sure to keep the open paint cans away from children and pets. RECYCLE

All recyclables will be collected on an every other week basis. All recyclables must be placed in the recycling cart provided by the township. Place your recycling cart on one side of your driveway and your trash cart on the other. Replacement and additional carts requests can be made to the Northville Township Department of Public Service.

CANS

Recyclable: Food and beverage cans, rinsed with labels removed. Stack smaller cans inside larger with lids between. Clean aluminum foil is also accepted.
Not Recyclable: Paint cans, siding, tubing, framing, etc.

GLASS

Recyclable: Clean clear glass and all clean colored glass is accepted for recycling. Throw lids, neck rings, foil, Styrofoam, and plastic labels in the trash. Paper labels may remain.
Not Recyclable: Light bulbs, ceramics, porcelain, window glass, etc.

NEWSPAPERS/CARDBOARD

Recyclable: Items include newspapers, glossy inserts, magazines, phone books, paperboard, boxboard, corrugated cardboard (please cut to fit in the recycling cart), office paper, magazines, junk mail, envelopes.
Not Recyclable: Tissue paper, decorative wrapping paper.

PLASTICS

Recyclable: Plastic containers marked on the bottom with the recycle symbol numbered 1-7 (rinse and flatten). Remove lids. Examples of type 1 plastic recyclables include clear, squeezable containers like soda pop bottles. Examples of type 2 plastic recyclables include milk and water jugs and laundry detergent bottles.
Not Recyclable: Plastic containers for motor oil or cooking oil, pesticide containers, Styrofoam.

COMPOST

Curbside pickup of residential yard waste runs from the third full week in March through the third full week in December. Place compostables separate from your trash and along side of your recyclables on regular trash pickup day. No containers over 50 pounds or over 35 gallons in size will be accepted.

INSTRUCTIONS

Residents can compost grass clippings, leaves, yard and garden waste (excluding pumpkins), pruning debris and brush. Prepare twigs, branches, brush and pruning by tying materials with heavy twine into bundles not longer than 4 feet and weighing no more than 50 pounds. Tree removal (trunk, stump, root ball) is not accepted. Grass clippings, leaves, and garden waste can only be placed in 30 gallon paper compost bags or 35 gallon reusable containers with sturdy handles marked with a large X and placed facing the street. Do not compost food scraps, animal waste, chemicals, or sod. New biodegradable plastic bags are **NOT** accepted for yard waste removal.
